# LINDSAY DAVENPORT



Three time grand slam singles champion and former world #1 Lindsay Davenport will return for her seventh year for The 10th Annual Wailea Fantasy Tennis Camp in Maui, which will be held November 16-20, 2016 at Wailea Tennis Club and Four Seasons Resort Maui. Participants will be treated to world class instruction and match play with Davenport, Former #1 and Two Time US Open Champion Tracy Austin, Former U.S. Davis Cup Captain Tom Gullikson and Former ATP player Justin Gimelstob.

Lindsay Davenport has been ranked number one in singles and doubles on the WTA Tour. She has won three Grand Slam singles tournaments and earned an Olympic Gold Medal in singles in 1996. She has won 55 WTA Tour singles titles and 37 doubles titles, and is one of only four women since 1975 who have been the year-end world number one player at least four times. Lindsay is currently a commentator for Tennis Channel.

“We are pleased to have Hall of Famer Lindsay Davenport back for one of our strongest fields to date” said Cathy Nicoloff, Camp Director from Wailea Tennis Club, which in February 2012 was voted one of the top fifty tennis resorts in the U.S. by Tennis Magazine and #1 in Hawaii. Adult tennis players from throughout the globe will converge on Wailea for an intense four days of instruction, drills, video analysis and play with the pro’s. “We are very excited for our 10th Anniversary Celebration this November at The Four Seasons Resort Maui”, added Nicoloff.

# TOM GULLIKSON

## BIOGRAPHY

Tom Gullikson has had an illustrious career. He reached a career high of #34 in the world in singles and #4 in doubles , most notably in performances with twin brother Tim. The duo reached the Wimbledon final in 1983. Gullikson won 1 career singles title and 15 career doubles titles, and has coached such top players as Jennifer Capriati, Todd Martin, Pete Sampras and Jim Courier. From 1994-1999 he served as US Davis Cup Captain, leading the team to victory in 1995. He also coached the U.S. Olympic Team in 1996 where he helped Andre Agassi win the gold medal. He currently is a lead national coach with the USTA National Player Development Program where he has coached ATP Players Denis Kudla and Sam Querrey.



# TRACY AUSTIN

Tennis prodigy Tracy Austin stormed into women's tennis in 1977 and set a number of amazing records as the youngest player in the sport. In 1977, she was the youngest winner of a pro tournament when she won her first title at Avon Futures of Portland, Oregon, at the age of 14 years, 28 days. That same year, as an unseeded amateur, she reached the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open. In 1979, she won her first major title at the Italian Open where she defeated Chris Evert in the semifinals and severed Chris' 125-match clay court winning streak. She then defeated Chris again that year to become the youngest player to win the U.S. Open at the age of 16 years and nine months. In 1980, she ranked No. 1 in the world and set a



new record as the youngest NO. 1 ranked player in tennis history. From 1978 to 1983, she was ranked in the Top Ten, and from 1980-81 she was No. 2.

In 1980, she reached \$1 million in career prize money, becoming the youngest player at the time, male or female, at the age of 17 years, 8 months to reach that mark. That same year, she and her brother, John, became the only brother/sister team to win Wimbledon mixed doubles in history. In 1981, she won her second U.S. Open title in a thrilling tiebreak finish over Martina Navratilova. Tracy defeated Chris and Martina back-to-back five times, and she led the career head-to-head against Chris 9-8.

In 1983, her back injuries limited her play, and then in 1989 she was involved in a near-fatal car accident that resulted in a broken leg that eventually ended her playing career.

# JUSTIN GIMELSTOB



## BIOGRAPHY

Justin Gimelstob is an American broadcaster, producer and former tennis professional. Justin won 13 ATP doubles titles, as well as consecutive Grand Slam mixed doubles titles with Venus Williams at the 1998 Australian Open and French Open. He won the Boy's National Championships in an unprecedented three age groups (14's in 1991, 16's in 1993, and 18's in 1995) and led UCLA to an NCAA runner-up finish and won the NCAA Doubles title in 1996. While at UCLA, Justin was an All-American in both singles and doubles, was the #1 ranked player in singles and doubles, and maintained the highest GPA (4.0) of any student athlete at UCLA. Justin reached a career high of #63 in singles and #18 in doubles on the ATP World Tour. Justin was also an active member of the US Davis Cup Team. Justin retired from the ATP World Tour after the 2007 season and made a successful transition into sports and entertainment broadcasting.

Justin has worked with Tennis Channel, CBS, NBC, Fox Sports, Fox Sports Radio, ESPN, The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, CNN, TV Guide and Extra. Through his production company, "Without Limits Productions" Justin also hosts and co-produces a show about life on the ATP World Tour called, "ATP World Tour Uncovered" which is distributed to over 150 countries worldwide. He also hosts and produces "Players Give Back" a yearly look at the tennis community's commitment to philanthropy.



Justin also hosts his own long form interview show called "Holding Court With Justin Gimelstob" where he has interviewed guests from the tennis, sports, and entertainment worlds, ranging from Rafael Nadal, John McEnroe, Jimmy Connors, Serena Williams and Lindsey Vonn to Greg Norman and Randy Jackson.

Justin is serving his 3rd term on the ATP World Tour Board of Directors as a representative of the players and has been one of the most successful advocates for player's rights since the Tour's inception. The ATP recently named Justin the Chairman of Player Business. Justin is also a worldwide ambassador for Technology Company SAP, Babolat, Nike, and Zico Coconut water.

Justin is passionate about philanthropy, and dedicates time to the Justin Gimelstob Children's Fund. Since the Fund's inception in 1998, Justin has hosted events with the support of Pete Sampras, Andy Roddick, John McEnroe, Lindsay Davenport, James Blake and the Bryan twins, and has donated over 1 million dollars to The Valerie Fund, an organization that supports children with cancer and other blood disorders.
